We met with her creditors and paid her debts in full; her tears of sorrow now replaced with tears of joy. Her children call it a miracle from God- a miracle that you helped to happen.



A DISCOURAGING WORD

A precious couple in our congregation (wife American and husband Mexican), tearfully shared their concern that she was going to get deported. Despite hiring a lawyer and working with immigration for months, her deadline was Thursday and, if nothing happened by she could be arrested and/or deported. To make matters worse, their lawyer expressed strong foreigner sentiments and quit- even though they had already paid him. The church prayed for them, but daily trips to office produced the nothing. Wednesday's prayer meeting, she said her goodbyes and we prayed over them again. The next morning, a judge suddenly granted visa. Another answered prayer.

Safety is not foremost here, as is apparent from this water cooler dripping on two electrical plugs at our local clinic.

THIRD-WORLD MEDICINE

During a recent trip to the "Invación" (the name given to the slums), Alan passed a wooden shack right as a toddler fell from the window. Rushing over to help the bleeding and dazed child, he offered the family a ride to the hospital. Arriving at the free hospital for the poor, an attendant wiped down the child's bleeding head, affixed a bandage, and sent them on their way. Needless to say, Alan took the child to another hospital where she received proper medical care.

This month alone, we have assisted 10 people (mostly children) in receiving urgently needed medical attention.
