Then April arrives, bringing heart-wrenching goodbyes; sometimes for just a few months and sometimes forever. Suddenly, those we have learned to lean on are gone, but the needs of the poor continue and we struggle on.

These are the highs and lows of our life in Mexico. This is our normal.



A PLACE OF OUR OWN


